Welcome to Woodruff Summer Camp for 2014! The Leader Update(s) will provide needed information that will allow you to better plan your adventure at Woodruff. We will also post all updates on atlantabsa.org/woodruff.

Notes from the Program Director (Fred Gates)

Balanced Program - The best program at camp is the one that offers a healthy balance between recreation and advancement, free time and structured activity, group events and individual pursuits. Each Scout should be allowed to enjoy his surroundings, pursue his interests, and build friendships.

There are more activities at camp than anyone can accomplish in a single week, which is why we suggests Scouts and Adult Leaders select a small number of activities to enjoy rather than trying to cram too many experiences into the week.

Scouts and Adult Leaders are not obligated to take part in every activity. Young Scouts in particular seem to enjoy spending their week fishing, catching frogs, and swimming, rather than being rushed from activity to activity. It is important to remember that Scouts grow and learn just as much from these leisurely pursuits as they do from earning Merit Badges and picking up camping skills.

One of the goals of the Boy Scouts is to foster a love of the outdoors, and sometimes that is best accomplished by simply being outdoors.

Here are some tips:

Be aware of which badges require the most skill, endurance, or written work, since those will require more time during the week. Examples of these are: Environmental Science, Lifesaving, Archery, Rifle Shooting, Shotgun Shooting, Pottery, and Climbing.

Merit Badge work at camp can be made easier if the Scout does some advanced work at home. Camp is not an ideal place for Scouts to complete written work. Scouts can prepare by completing their written work before arrival. Obtaining the Merit Badge pamphlet and at least knowing the requirements is a great place to start. In the case of are WSR Shooting Sports, download the workbooks for archery, rifle, and shotgun.

Don't forget to schedule rest time. That's right, rest. Too often Scouts don't take the time to sit back and enjoy the beauty Mother Nature has to offer. This goes for Scoutmasters as well.

While there are some activities that require pre-signing up (climbing, biking, troop whitewater), the following activities at camp do not require signing up. Just show up and have fun: Open archery, open rifle, horseshoes, GaGa ball, field sports games, nature hikes, open boating, open swimming, playing on the camp aqua toys (iceberg and blob), orienteering course, fitness/challenge course, softball, disc golf, slack lining, polar bear plunge, and visiting the Davis Inn – an Appalachian outpost camp.

Program Registration Website:

Program registration will open beginning in April. Refer to the Leader Guide for additional info. Program registration opens to registered units that are current with their February 1 payments. You

will not be able to “log in” to the site prior to your start date. Again, program registration will be done on the www.atlantabsacamp.org website beginning with a staggered registration starting on April 1st. An separate leader update/email will be sent out later this month with sign-up instructions.

Camp Information/Website:

Again, we will use the council website (atlantabsa.org/woodruff) to post camp info. The camp website; www.atlantabsacamp.org will only be used beginning with program registration in April.

Camp Stats:

Woodruff has limited space available in several weeks. Be sure to keep current on your payments, since units that fail to pay risk getting dropped from camp.

Leader Training Reservation Form and Schedule:

This year, all adult training opportunities that require pre-camp registration will be on one form (not on the program website) that must be completed and sent to the AAC. Courses that will be on this form; LNT Training, Red Cross C-Pro and CPR, Red Cross First Aid, Red Cross WRFA. Look for this form to be available by the 2nd week of April.

Note: Changes in pricing of Red Cross classes/certifications have caused this form to be delayed.

Provisional Campers:

If you have Scouts that are looking to add a 2nd week to their Woodruff Experience, or just need to come on a different week from your troop, then refer them to the Provisional Camper form at atlantabsa.org/woodruff. Provisional programs are only offered on camp week’s 5, 6, 7.

Special Note / Troop Participant #'s: Units have until 2 weeks prior to camp to adjust their numbers. If they are already registered, it is ok to add more Scouts. If you see large changes in numbers (+/-), please notify Veronica Bramlett immediately either by email or letter.

Special Requests:

You will have the opportunity when the program website opens in April, to record any “special requests” that impact your unit or individuals in your unit. Note that this is the ONLY WAY to communicate those issues/challenges to us. Those requests might impact medical support, food allergies, campsite location, electricity, etc. Please **do not** communicate those items to us in any other medium.
